

Yard Sign Guidelines

- Place signs perpendicular to the street so they can be seen both ways.
- Do not place a sign on anyone's yard or property without their permission.
- NEVER destroy or move other candidates' signs.
- Signs are not permitted on trees, lights, telephone poles, on City right-of-way other than the small portion that abuts private property, on median strips, between sidewalks and the curb or edge of paving, attached to any other sign, or on State or County right-of-way.
- Signs must be a minimum of six feet from the curb or edge of the pavement where no sidewalk exists.
- Signs can be located anywhere on the side of the sidewalk away from the street where a sidewalk exists. No part of any sign should be located on or extend over any portion of the sidewalk.
- Where there is no pavement, signs are required to be a minimum of six feet from the edge of the portion of the road designed or used for vehicular traffic, and where a sidewalk exists, anywhere on the side of the sidewalk away from the street.
- Remember to gather up and discard all signs on public property no later than one week after the election.
